Beacon

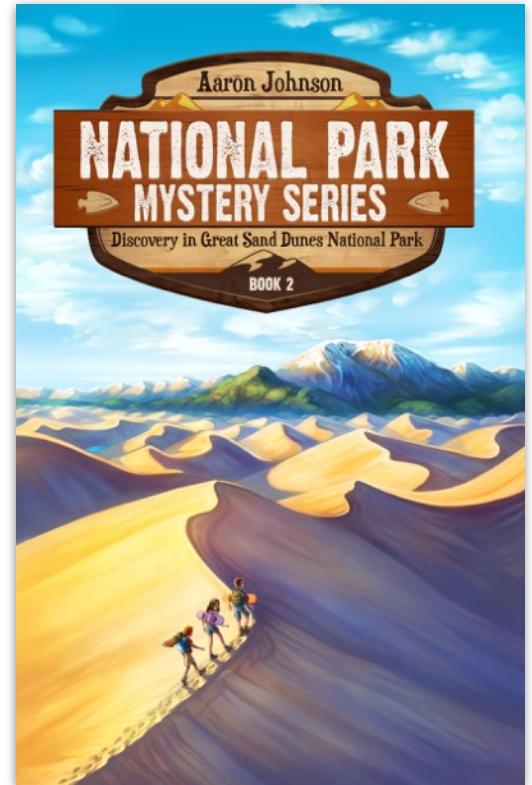
n. - A device used to signal your location and alert others to an emergency.

Sheer

adj. - Extremely thin or steep.

Sinewy
